- · The various grades will be having their class parties on Wednesday, 4 December.




# **SCHOOL FEES** PAYMENT REMINDER

#### **Payment Options Available:**




**Termly:** Fees are either paid in full for the whole term or three equal instalments of the total invoiced amount
