Helpful Tips for Parents to Encourage Diligence at Home

2.Set Realistic Goals – Help your child break tasks into smaller, manageable steps. Celebrate progress rather than just final achievements.

3.Encourage a Growth Mindset – Teach your child that mistakes are part of learning. Emphasize effort, perseverance, and problem-solving over immediate success.

4.Limit Distractions – Create a focused environment for study time by reducing screen time and setting clear expectations for when work needs to be completed.

5.Be a Role Model – Children learn by example. Demonstrate diligence in your own work, commitments, and responsibilities.

6.Recognize and Reward Effort – Acknowledge your child's hard work with positive reinforcement. A simple "I'm proud of your effort" goes a long way in building motivation.
